

FELIX GATINEAU
LEADER of the FRENCH CANADIAN COMMUNITY
in SOUTHBRIDGE

The following is the text appearing on the monument erected at South and Main Streets:

On the back of the monument:

Born in Canada, November 12, 1857
Settled in Southbridge, in 1877
Died December 31, 1927

While ever retaining his affection for the land of his birth, he achieved the highest type of citizenship in his adopted country. For fifty years he served the community faithfully and well in offices of honor and trust

Organized 1888
- Selectman 1893
- Overseer of the poor 1895-1906
- Sealer of Weights & Measures 1914-1927
- Representative Massachusetts Legislature
1906, 1920-21, 1927
- Trustee Massachusetts School for Feeble Minded at Waverly 1907-
1913
